

Food truck fire stopped by portable fire extinguisher

Bystanders in Longport, NJ are being credited for preventing disaster after using a portable fire extinguisher to stop a food truck fire. As the food truck workers struggled to put out the flames, a neighbor assisted a nearby off-duty officer with a portable fire extinguisher. Together, they put out the fire before it could spread to a large propane tank at the rear of the truck. When fire crews arrived, the fire was fully extinguished. The Longport Police Department issued a safety alert afterward, urging residents and businesses to keep fire extinguishers on hand. Staff use extinguishers to contain nursing home fire

Quick-thinking staff at the Somerset Ridge Center nursing home are being credited with containing an early morning fire on August 7. When a blaze broke out in an unoccupied community room on the second floor, staff immediately isolated the room and used portable fire extinguishers to suppress the flames. Somerset Fire officials praised their actions, noting that staff not only contained the fire, but they also sheltered and relocated residents to safety. 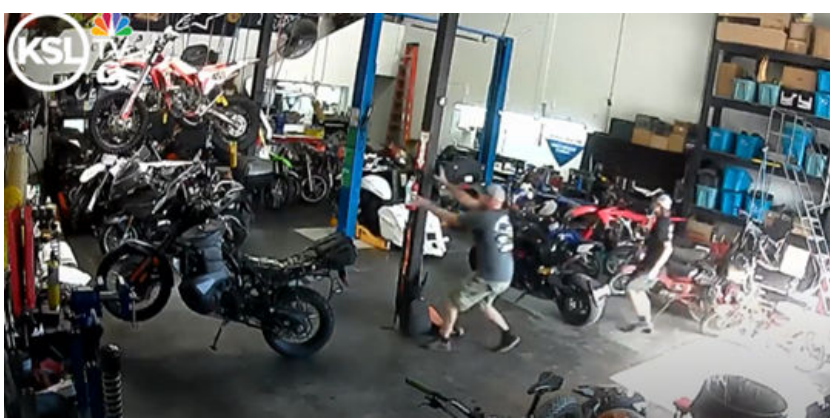

Employees use extinguishers to save man, prevent disaster

Employees at a motorcycle shop in Woods Cross, UT are being hailed as heroes after a violent explosion at a nearby storage garage left one man seriously injured. When flames erupted, the motorcycle shop's staff immediately grabbed portable fire extinguishers and rushed to the scene. Within moments, the employees had used extinguishers to put out flames that had burned the victim and keep the fire from spreading to nearby containers of methanol. Fire officials said that the employees' swift use of extinguishers not only saved the man's life but also prevented a chain reaction that could have destroyed the entire building.
